Category B: Changing Optional From Graduation Subject

"Switch if you're weak in your graduation subject or uninterested in it. But switch smartly."

1 Consider Multiple Factors

Evaluate strengths, resources, and scoring patterns.

2 Impact of Right Choice

Right optional can boost your rank, wrong one can cause struggles.

3 Strategic Evaluation

Carefully assess options to make this important decision.



Selection Criteria (Descending Priority Order)



Rank	Criteria	Notes & Examples
1	Scoring Consistency (270–320+ range possible)	E.g. Anthropology, PSIR, Sociology, Philosophy
2	Genuine Interest + Conceptual Clarity	You'll revise 10+ times —better if you enjoy it. Literature is great for avid readers.
3	Good Coaching + Notes Availability	E.g. Shubhra Ranjan (PSIR), Triumph IAS (Sociology), Vijetha IAS (Anthro)
4	Time to Finish	Anthro, Socio, Philosophy take 3–3.5 months; Geo/History = 5+ months
5	GS Overlap	PSIR (GS2 + IR), Geo (GS1 + Envi), Socio (GS1 + Ethics), Anthro (Essay + Ethics examples)
6	Essay & Ethics Synergy	PSIR, Socio, Anthro, Philosophy = frequent theme overlap
7	Prelims/Mains/Interview Relevance	Optional like PSIR, Anthropology, Socio = easy use in Essay, GS answers, personality test
8	Static Nature (Low Current Affairs Dependency)	Less newspaper stress. E.g. Anthro, Sociology, Philosophy
9	Time & Energy Cost Per Day	Pick one that fits your daily schedule if working/college student



Popular Optionals - SWOT Snapshot




Optional	Pros	Caution Points
PSIR	GS2 + IR overlap, good essay & interview use	Slightly dynamic; takes 4–5 months
Sociology	Easy to grasp, helps GS 1, Ethics & Essay	Needs diverse examples; abstract topics
Anthropology	Scoring, diagrams, fast to finish	Bio/tribal part needs visual memory
Philosophy	Short, static, Ethics + Essay booster	May feel difficult to science grads
Geography	Maps + environment link + GS1 benefit	Syllabus-heavy, uncertain marks esp in hindi medium
History	Covers GS1 + Essay + Interviews	Huge content, difficult to revise fully, unpredictable qs
Maths	Objectivity, high scoring if mastered	Time consuming, Only for engineering confident students
Medical Sci	Natural choice for doctors, scoring	No GS overlap, factual content
Literature	Static, predictable, great for readers	Needs strong writing; no GS benefit
Management	Good for MBA grads; structured & logical	Less coaching availability
